

we must approach the island names with that
in mind, their use or appearance after the whiten
began to come. The mainland and interior was
not so early affected. "Damerili Ile" may
have been one of them so occupied in 1616 when
Smith adopted the island ^{name} from the principal occu-
pant, a fishing venturer of course. Agguhega
may refer to this situation though I confess to a
limited acquaintance with its component parts. It
is possibly Agwi, or Akwi or Ahque, either of which
may be a clue to its significance. It is without
doubt an unsculpted word as it stands.

Again, pardon my prolixity. I have
had a chance for over a year to talk heap
big Indian talk and I hope I may have
a chance to look over Prof. Sawney's work
before long.
