Order from the House of Representatives, appointing Messrs Hodgkins of Lewiston, Foster of Pembroke, Cook of Waterboro, Busbank of Gilead, Dunlap of Brunswick, Smart of Plymouth and Cram of New Sharon a committee with such as the Senate may join, to take into consideration the propriety of erecting a suitable Monument over the remains of Enoch Lincoln, late Governor of Maine, in memory of his distinguished services to this State—read and passed and Messrs Liverance, Soule and Edward Robinson are joined in concurrence.
