Ques. Did the same hold true if patients asked for clothing and you thought they could bear it. Ans. Yes sir.

Ques. There are how many rooms in each lodge. Ans. 8, and 3 lodges on the male side.

Ques. Were those rooms generally all occupied each night. Ans. Generally occupied.

Ques. How many of the 24 on an average night would be put in without any clothing. Ans. Perhaps 3 or 4, I mean without their clothes they wore in the day time.

Ques. How many out of those 3 in an average night would be supplied with bed clothing. Ans. All of them; with plenty of straw, or clothing or both.

Ques. Whether ~~out~~ of those three who were put in without their own garments, were usually were supplied with bed clothing as well as with straw. Ans. Usually they were.

Ques. In some cases they had to be taken away. Ans. Yes, in some cases they would take it away themselves; sometimes they would throw it out of their room.

Ques. Were those cases where they were put in both without their garments and without bedding extremely
