(the Tuesday tribe (probably John Francis) who had started to walk back because he wanted to save the money given him. The tribe here were very angry at the sight this put upon them, as if they had neglected to pay his way. Old John Francis was son then my old. He

was 14 years old when he carried his father & fought the English at Machias. He died aged 110 years. Father

saw him in 1874 (<sup>1875</sup>) & alone that time when he & Schellott went to Pleasant Point. He was blind & very ill but

of clear mind & lived some years longer. As the attack was in 1777, he must have died in 1873 or been still older. But

he told father that he carried his father to the fight at Machias & that he was then "just 14 years old; how old I be then?"

He's of a mischievous nature. He was 65 when he died & his father's career went well on.
