

The word I gave you was Takemmy,
not Jakemmy.

Two words of common origin are Chappa-
quiddich (vineyard) and Chebeag Island in
Carcot Bay. Both are from the root Tchepi
= Separated. The former means Separated
Island (a quiden-ek), i.e. separated from
the Vineyard proper - while the latter means
The Separated land - its physical character-
istics today are described in an old deed,
"the 5th Island being at High water a two Islands,
yet is but one Island". I believe however that
Chebeag is an abbreviation of Tchepi-aguiden]

In the Simancas map of 1610 may be found
one of the few Indian names attached to our Maine
coast - Tahanoock at the mouth of the St George
River - which I translate as Atahan-ank =
Hill land in reference to the Camden Hills
seen by Weymouth and described also by
Popham in his record of voyage in 1606.
