Order from the House of Representatives, instructing the Committee on Agriculture to inquire into the expediency of repealing an Act concerning "Stud Horses," passed March 24th 1836. — read and passed in concurrence.

Petition of Samuel Taylor, praying to be remunerated for expenses incurred in criminal actions — read and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, in concurrence.

Petition of C. W. Washburn and others, praying for an Act to prevent the destruction of pickard in twelve mile pond — read and referred to the Committee on Interior Fisheries, in concurrence.

Petition of the town of Camden, praying for an alteration of the Constitution of the State, came up from the House referred to a Joint Select Committee, consisting on the part of the House of Messrs Chase of Camden, Lowell of East Machias, Oakes of Sangerville, Emery of Saco, Smalley of St. George, Pratt of Parkman, Littlefield of Winot, Stanley of Farmington, Pillsbury of Bucksport and Greenwood of Hebron with such as the Senate may join — read and referred and Messrs Higgins, Mildrum and Robinson of Lincoln
