

Also against Ebenezer Knock and Nathaniel Brackett, they having also refused to come to a settlement agreed to their contract in July last - and Altho Samuel Henderson is one of those who once agreed to purchase and has not complied; it is your Committees opinion that no action be as yet brought against him, as from information he may probably settle without -

It appears to your Committee that it will also be necessary to commence actions in the name of the Propriety against certain other persons, occupiers of Land belonging to some of the Proprietors, and more particularly the following persons whose Lots were drawn by Col. Waters at the Division in September last, they refusing to come to a settlement, or make any consideration for their respective Lots, provided Col. Waters shall indemnify the propriety, any charges that may accrue in the prosecution of said actions. Viz Joseph Pike - John Sears - Moses Goe - John Senesvieri - James Forge - and Samuel Senesvieri and such of them as he shall chuse to proceed against - And whereas from the information received by Col. Waters while at Waverborough respecting the settlers of that part of the Land belonging to the Propriety called Coeshall, it is probable they may refuse to settle with those persons who draw the Lots they are upon, and as some others of the Occupiers may refuse to come to a settlement with such of the proprietors as have respectively drawn their several Lots - your Committee are of opinion that actions should be commenced in the name of the propriety against each and every such delinquent as the particular proprietor of such Lot may chuse, they respectively first indemnifying the propriety for the cost of suit and expences that may accrue in consequence of such of their respective prosecutions - as it may be expedient for the interest of the propriety; that all delinquents be proceeded with immediately excepting Samuel Henderson before mentioned - It is the opinion
