

Friday, February 24th 1837

Petition of Samuel Paine and others, praying for leave to erect a Dam across the Sabaticook River near its mouth - read and referred to the Committee on Interior Waters, in concurrence.

A message was received from the House of Representatives, informing the Senate that the House, insisting on their vote finally passing the "Resolves authorizing a Loan in behalf of the State," propose a Conference and appoint as conferees Messrs. Holmes of Alfred, Brooks of York, and Comstock of Lubec and asking the concurrence of the Senate. The Senate concurs with the House in the proposition for a Conference and appoints as conferees Messrs. Hoagsum, Littlefield, and Gunn.

M^r Benson from the Committee on Bad Roads and Canals reported order of notice to next Legislature on petition of General Wilson and others - read and the same, on motion of M^r Benson was laid upon the table.

The reports of the Committee on Interior Waters, to which was referred the Bill to incorporate the "Wapalborough and Sidney Dam Company" that said Bill ought not to pass was taken up and accepted.
