

Copy of a Petition to the Hon^{ble} Samuel Danforth Esq^r
Province of Massachusetts Bay

To the Hon^{ble} Samuel Danforth Esq^r One of his Majesty's Justices
of the Peace throughout the Province aforesaid - humbly shew
The subscribers diverse of the Proprietors of a tract of common
& undivided Land in the late Province of Maine, holding
under Samuel Phillips & William Phillips, which Land
begins at the Sea-side at Winter Harbour, & runs up on the
West Side of Sauc River, in Breadth four Miles from said
River, till it meets with the Line between the Province of New
Hampshire & the said late Province of Maine, and so
running to the Patent of said Phillips their Claim: Appre-
-hending it necessary, that a meeting of the Proprietors
of said Tract of Land should be called & held as soon as
possible, do pray that your Honor would be pleased to
grant a Warrant for that purpose; said Meeting to be
held at the Towns Head in Boston on Wednesday the
seventh day of June next, at six o' Clock in the afternoon.
Then & there to chuse a moderator & Clerk - to take effectual
Measures to prevent Trespas on said Land, & to prosecute on
the Law all such as have trespassed thereon in times past
and in general to act upon all matters & things, which
may be necessary to promote the General Advantage
of the Proprietors
