marked B, adopt the amendment C, and
pass said Resolves to be engrossed as thus
amended. Sent down for concurrence.

Resolve authorizing the appointment of Clerks to
assist the Commissioners in revising the public laws
of the State came up — The House, having insisted
on its vote passing the same to be engrossed with
the amendment P, proposed a Conference, and
appoint as Conferees, Mr. Holmes of Alfred.

The Senate, insisting on the vote passing said
Resolves to be engrossed with the amendment O,
concur in the proposition for a Conference and
appoint as Conferees, Messrs. Benson, Robinson
of Lincoln, and Littlefield.
