The following is a report of the Committee appointed

Sept. 22nd 1789

In the year 1660 August 12th William Phillips of Boston purchased of Abombouit, alias John Rogamak, all his lands ^{lying} on the west side of Saco river, from the Salmon falls to Captain Shendys rocks, and so upward into the country to his furthest extent, and on the seventh of September 1660, every and seized by turf and twig, was taken by Lieutenant John Pike, in behalf of the grantee Phillips, in presence of Arnelus Woodman, & John Pope - Recorded July 31. 1717 in York County, Lib 8 fol. 220 - Signed and sealed and delivered before witnesses -

1661 March 30th - William Phillips purchased of Thuelin, all his land from Saco patent bound, southward beyond Saco Porpoise river, for breadth and from the head of Wells and Cape Porpoise Townships heads
