Petition of Chapin Varnum (and others, praying for a reduction of tolls on Damariscotta Bridge—read and referred to the Committee on Roads and Bridges, in concurrence.

Bill to incorporate the Kennebec Manufacturing Company, (introduced in the House) read and referred to the Committee on Manufactures, in concurrence

Bill to prevent the destruction of Salmon Trout—
— to set off lots 22, 23, 24 and 25 in the first range east, (and also, 87 a pond lot in Baldwin to Sebago,

Resolve for the relief of the Indigent Blind, (severally introduced in the Houses)

— providing for the erection of a Monument over the remains of the late Governor Lincoln (reported by the Joint Select Committee on an Order relative to that subject)

— authorizing the Governor to present a Medal to Doctor Usher Parsons (reported by the Joint Select Committee on an order relative to that subject); severally read once and three o'clock this afternoon assigned for a second reading.

Bill to regulate the running of lumber in the Medomak River, (reported by the Committee on Interior Waters, on petition of William Mathew and others;)
