To the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Moses Gill Esq<sup>r</sup> one of the Justices  
of the Peace throughout the Commonwealth of said  
thumblly sheweth The Subscribers desirous of the  
Proprietors of a tract of common, and undivided  
land in the late Province of Maine, but now in the  
County of York holding under Samuel Phillips  
and William Phillips, which Land begins at the  
Sea Side at Winter Harbour and runs up the West  
side of Saw River and adjoining thereunto, in breadth  
four miles from said River, till it meets with the  
Line between the State of New Hampshire, and the  
said late Province of Maine, and so running thro  
extent of the said Phillips their claim, apprehending  
it necessary that a meeting of the Proprietors of  
said tract of Land should be called and held as  
soon as possible to prevent that you there would be  
pleased to grant a warrant for that purpose,  
said meeting to be held at the American Coffee  
House in Boston on the Seventh day of September  
next at Six o'clock in the afternoon there and  
thence to chuse a moderator and Clerk, to take  
effectual measures to prevent trespass on said  
Land, and to chuse a Committee to prosecute  
in the Law all such as have trespassed or may  
trespass; and to prosecute a claim of trespass  
or Ejectment in the same and in the behalf  
of said proprietors Special Judgment and  
Execution and in these things to take upon  
them the defence of any Action or Actions which  
are or may be brought by other persons or pro-  
prietors not holding under the said Phillips  
against any person or persons for recovery of the  
whole or any part of the proprietors Land and to  
defend the same Special Judgment and to consider  
and determine what is proper to be done respecting  
the boundary line betwixt the propriety and the  
Commonwealth, and also to confer and join with  
the Proprietors claiming and holding Land  
under
