Waters hath attended generally to the Interest of the Propriety and very particularly to the business above referred to, and it appears to your Committee necessary to commend Actions of Ejectment to the Propriety and in December 1701 agreed to purchase the Lands of which they are now possessed, and they refuse to do any thing respecting the same, and
