On motions of Mr Robinson, of
Limestone. Ordered, That the Joint Standing
Committee be instructed to require of peti-
tioners for Acts of incorporation for the pur-
pose of lumbering, erecting mills, Saws
and other works for their convenience, before
considering their several claims, a partic-
ular description and plans of the location,
and estimate of the value of the premises owned
by them and the amount they have paid
on the same, together with the names, and
residences of the petitioners and the title by
which they hold the same, and an estimate
of the expense necessary to erect and put in
operation the Mills, or to construct the other
works contemplated, by some skillfull En-
gineer or Millwright and what length
of time will be necessary to finish the same, by
him certified; and also at what time the
construction of said Mills and other works
will be commenced—read and passed.
