Redman, Soule, Swift, Woodbury and  
Woodmane 8.  
Of which the House was informed by mes-  
sage and its concurrence requested.  
Bill additional to provide for the educa-  
tion of Youth (reported by Mr<sup>o</sup> Greene  
from the Committee on Literature  
and Literary Institutions to which  
said Bill had been referred)  
Resolve relative to the distribution of the an-  
nual School fund (reported by the same Gen-  
tlemen from the same Committee, on an  
order relative to the apportionment of the  
Bank tax, among such cities, towns,  
and plantations as have neglected to make  
returns of the numbers of their scholars)  
severally read once and to-morrow eleven  
o'clock apsigned for a second reading.
