To choose Agents to prosecute & defend Suits for said Proprietors, and to regain the Possession of such Lands as have been taken up & possessed by Impresario & other Introvers

To see whether the Proprietors will chuse a Committee to make Deeds of such Lands as the Proprietors shall see cause to sell or grant away. Also, do any thing that may be thought proper by said Propriety — Thomas Gushing
