X The committee appointed the 24th January 1788 to take under consideration the several articles in the warrant for calling the meeting of the proprietors of Land lying in the late Province of Maine holden under the will of Bridget Phillips late of Boston deceased have attended that service & report as follow —

X Your Committee finding that on the 13th March 1786 the propriety had appointed M^r John Bromfield, Col Josiah Waters, & John Avery jun^r a Committee to execute the deeds referred to in the warrant think it unnecessary to ^{act} any further in that matter; they being competent for that purpose — The Committee then proceeded to the examination of the accounts, the first acted upon was the honorable Judge Sewall —
