

Peter Ronco called every one who could read
 & write "ministers" One day, he said, he
 took three ministers out fishing and took
 also "little feestal [petrol] whicker"
 They talked with him about it "You need
 n't touched it" he said. But the fishing
 was not good and so as a solace Pete took
 "drop feestal". "Get big trout. Surely took
 nother drop, got nother trout. Every drop,
 you see, took me trout -" The ministers
 charmed at this simple but excellent
 method of procedure, were persuaded
 to try "feestal" them selves.

In Nov 1889. old Peter Ronco died in Dexter aged over one
 hundred years. He was from St. Francis P. Is. and possibly had
 some admixture of Indian blood. He was probably the father of the above
 was father of Peter W. Ronco who lives - see Peter's old home (1935)

One Ronco, a Kanoo, m. a Pleasant Point woman & her son
 Mr. Grace Francis. dau. of Joseph Francis. In a lumber quarrel he killed

another Indian & was sent to State Prison (perhaps 1905 or 1910) 1916. Mr. J. Francis
 died & as soon as possible (1917) Grace Ronco turned her on mother at 8 years & took the home
 Grace (Francis) Ronco died a few years later & another man came in & she died
