Q. Now a word as to the walking out exercises of the patients? A. I have seen no especial change in that. When I first went there I used to see parties of them out more or less, walking. But there is just this change: There is a park there, a small inclosure, and it is possible to take out a great many patients who could not well be allowed to go out much on public streets, and the result is that nearly every person who is able to walk, as I understand it, goes out as often as he desires to, and some of them are induced to go whenever feeling dilatory and lazy. The park is inclosed after a moderate fashion. It is not quite as strong a fence as might be desired for that purpose, but as strong as could be afforded at the time. Does very well. It incloses 3 or 4 acres. It is more or less provided with seats and walks, and
